The page numbers refer to the official New Zealand road code book. The QR code will take you to the relevant unit or chapter in the interactive Drive Road Code. Consider having students do the matching unit online before or after they practise with the layouts.

1 T intersections

This layout can be used to teach:

- » Give way rules (page 69-76).
- » Driving up to an intersection (page 70).
- » Illegal passing at an intersection (page 63).
- » Parking and stopping rules for parking near an intersection (page 90).

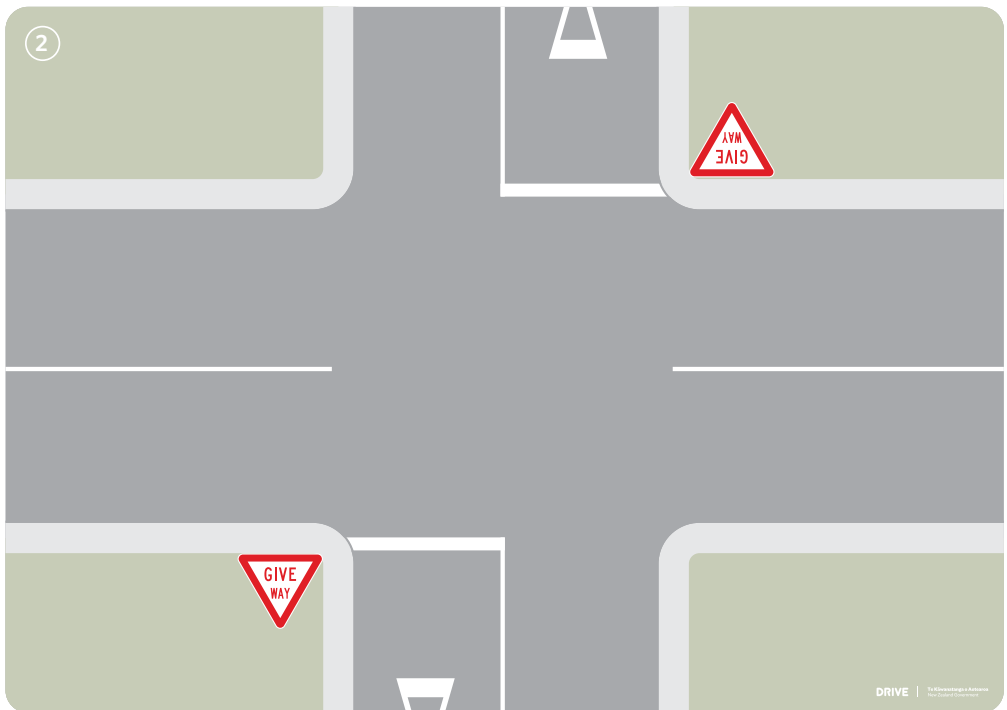

2 Intersections controlled by give way signs

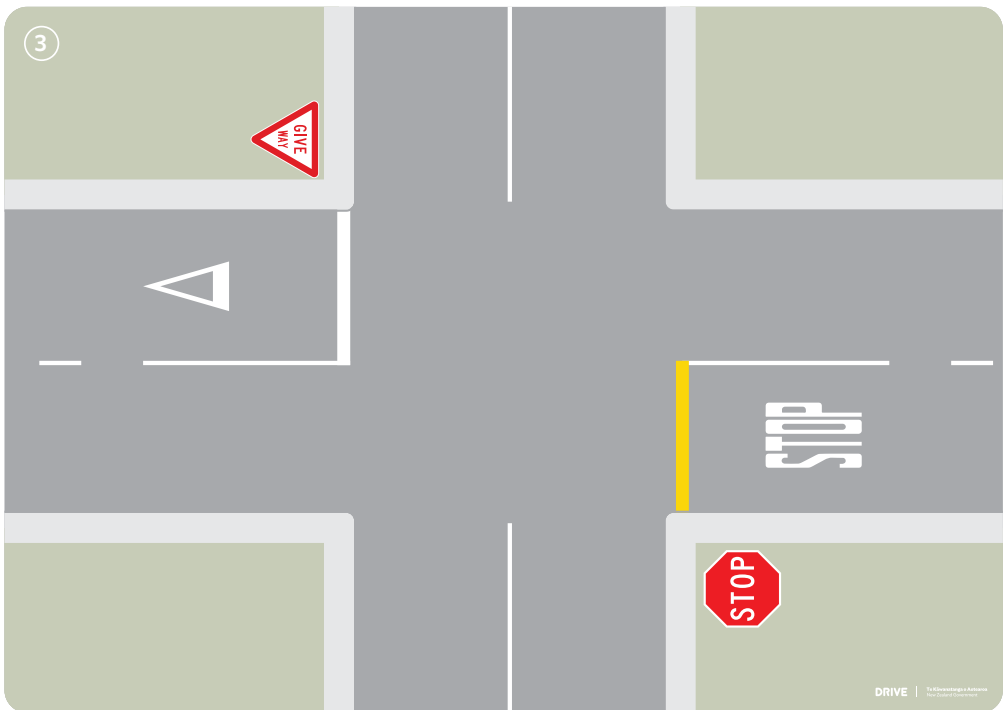

3 Intersections controlled by a stop sign and a give way sign

This layout can be used to teach:

- » Giving way when one vehicle is facing a stop sign and one vehicle is facing a give way sign (page 72).
- » The difference between give way signs and markings and stop signs and markings (page 71-72).

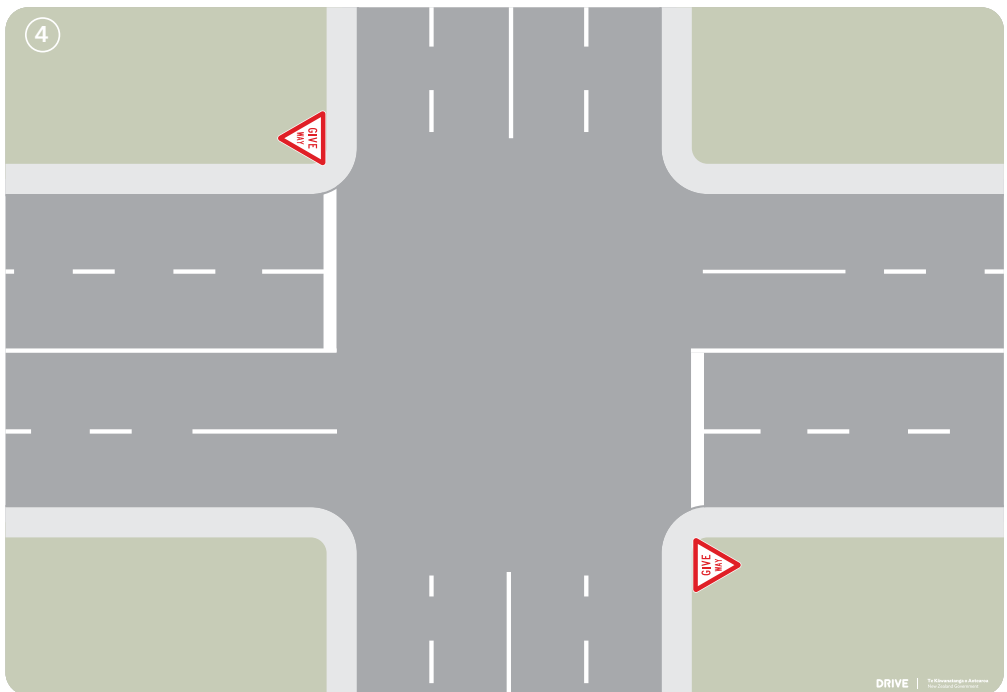

4 Give way and lane rules at intersections

This layout can be used to teach:

- » Give way rules (page 69-76).
- » Lane rules at intersections (page 51).
- » Making a right turn at an intersection with marked lanes (page 51).
- » Two vehicles turning into the same road at a laned intersection (page 53).
- » Changing lanes at an intersection (page 53).
- » Passing on the left at an intersection with more than one lane on your side of the road (page 64).
- » Passing on the right at an intersection with more than one lane on your side of the road (page 64).
- » Not blocking an intersection (page 95).

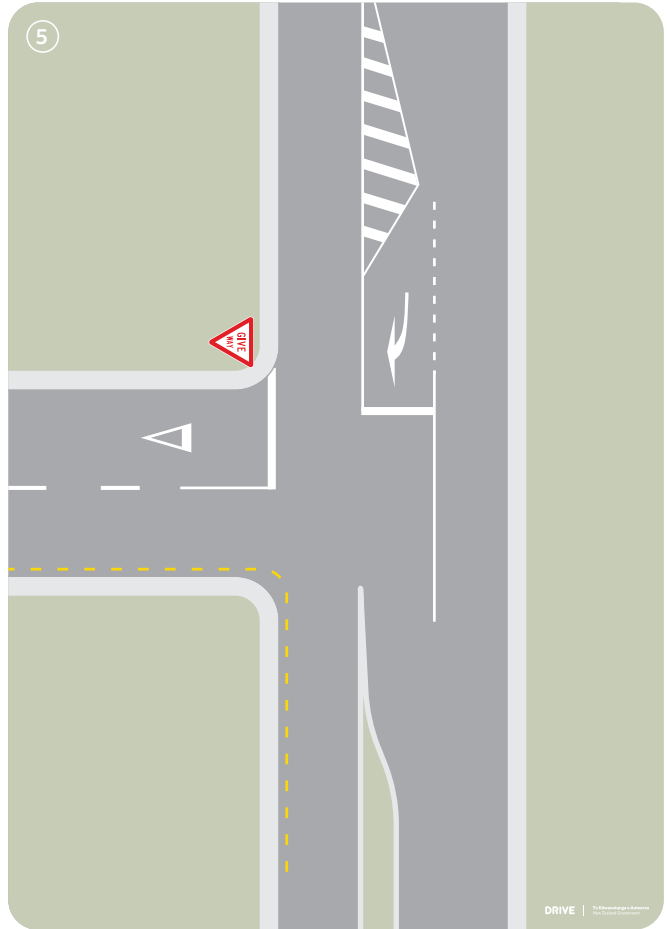

- » Parking and stopping rules for parking near an intersection (page 90).

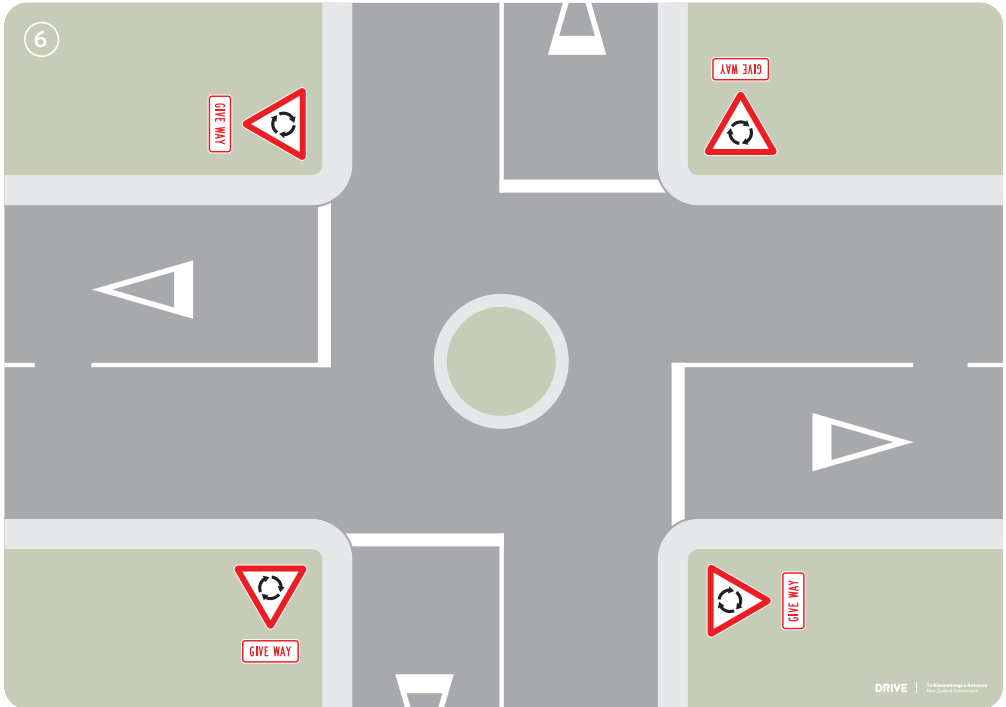

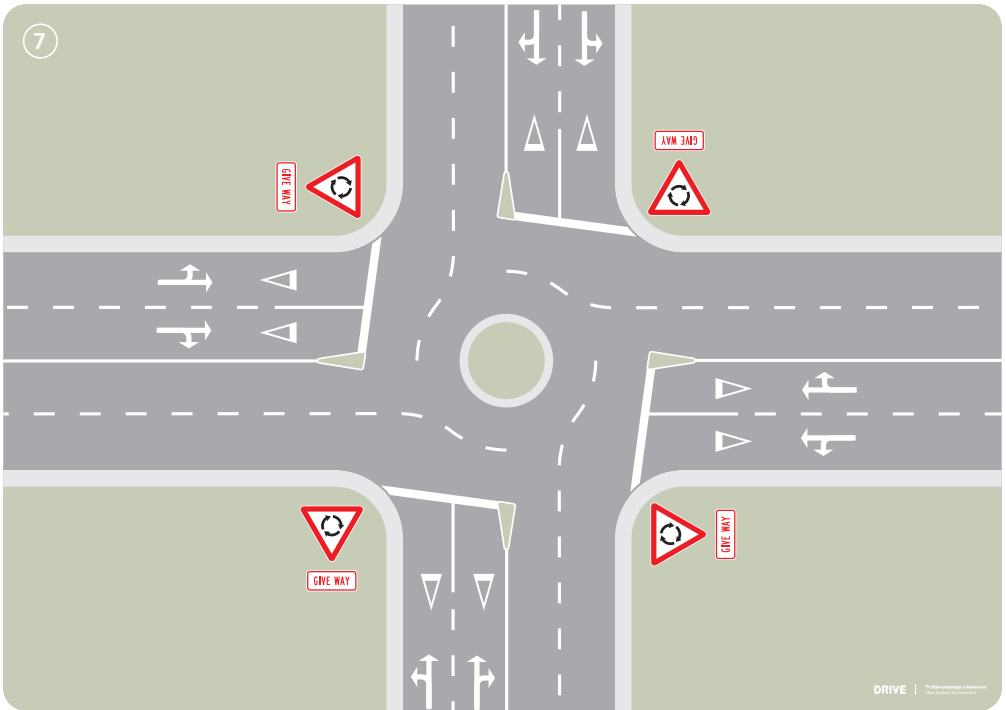

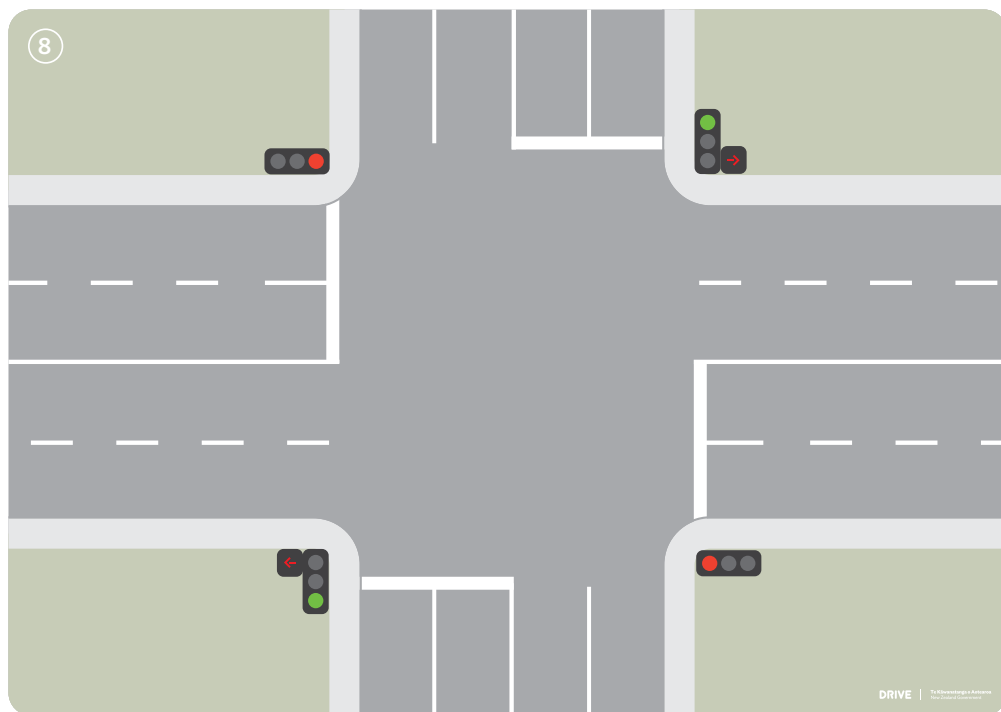

- » Giving way to pedestrians when turning at traffic lights (page 77).

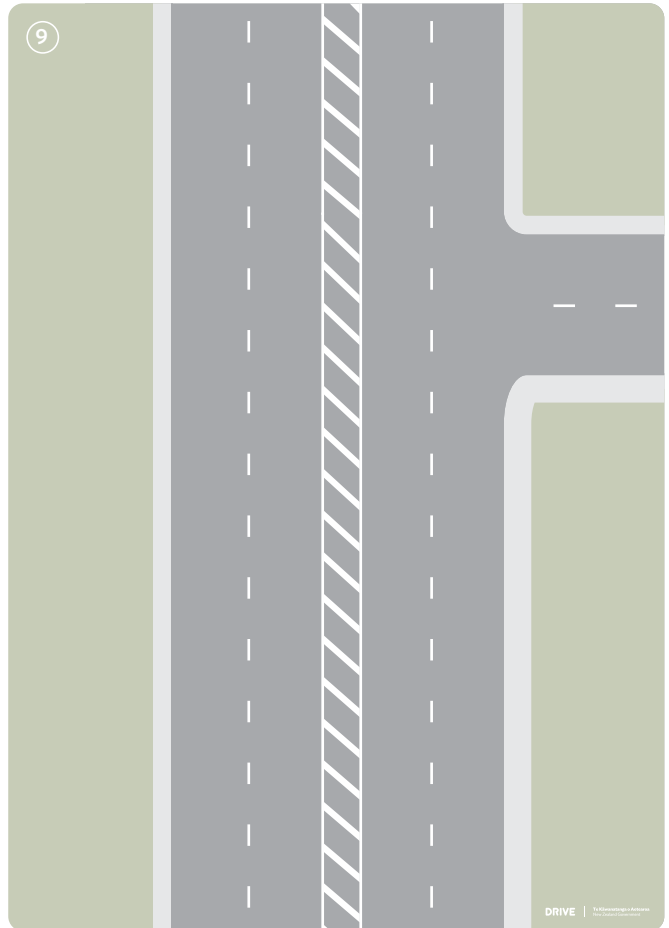

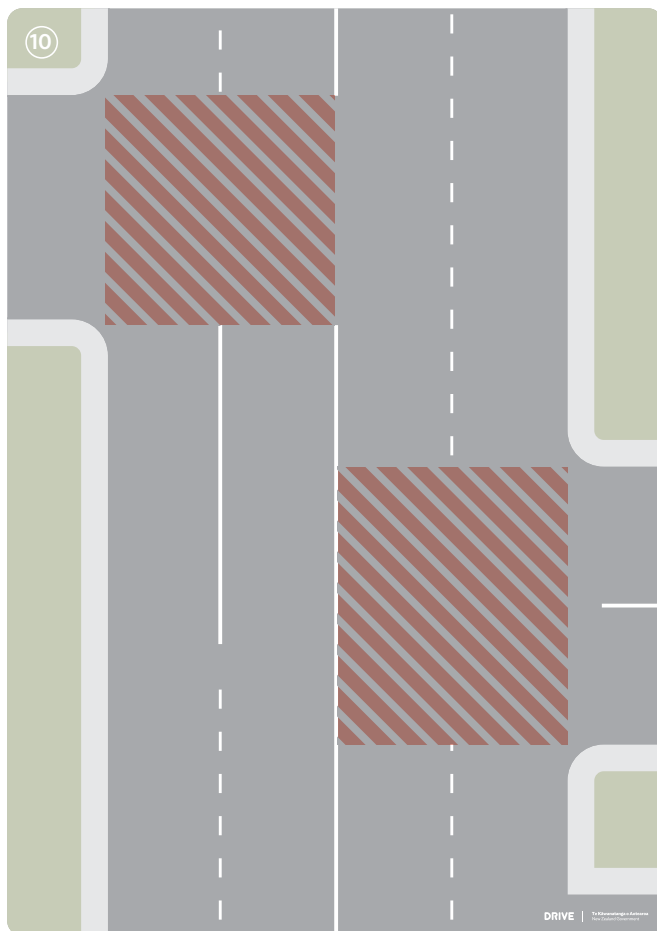

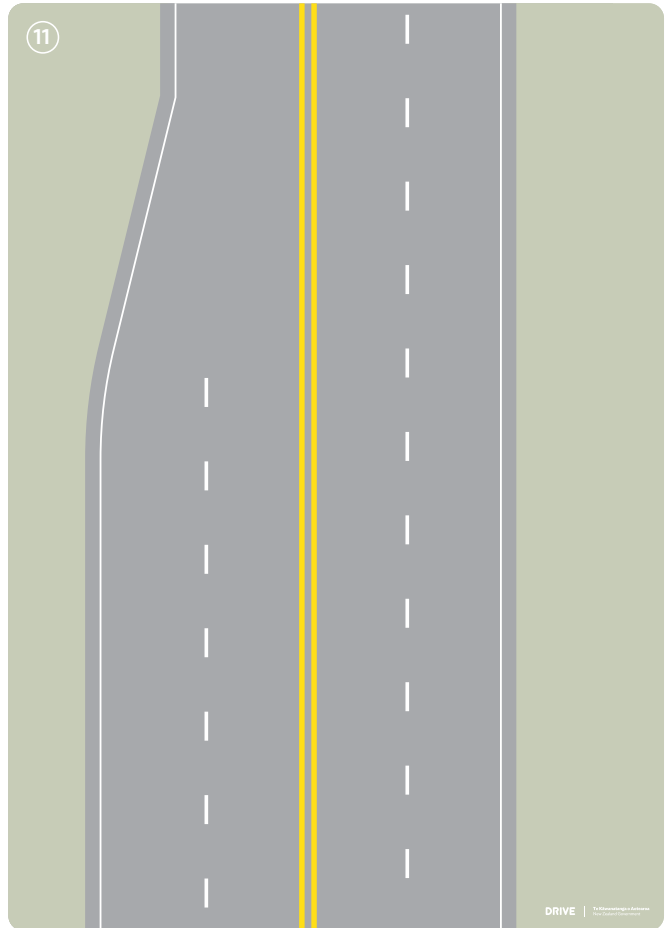

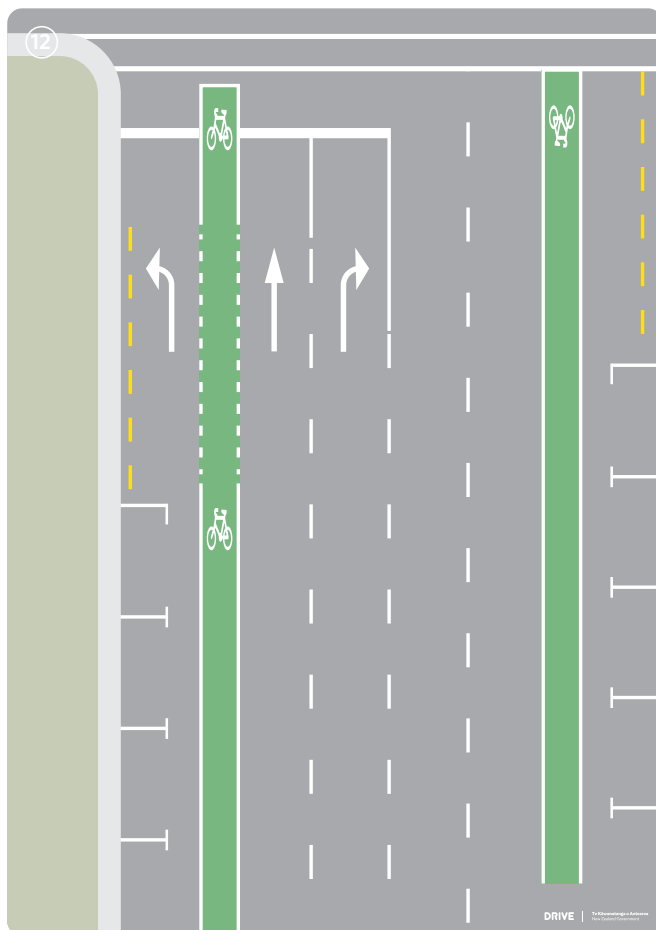

12 Cycle lanes

This layout can be used to teach:

- » Sharing the road with cyclists (page 164-166).
- » Crossing a cycle lane, checking for and giving way to cyclists (page 164-165).
- » Getting into the left lane to turn left when there is a cycle lane (page 164).
- » Not blocking a cycle lane (page 96).
- » Not stopping in a cycle lane (page 164).
- » Opening a car door (page 165).
- » Parking and stopping rules for broken yellow lines (page 90).

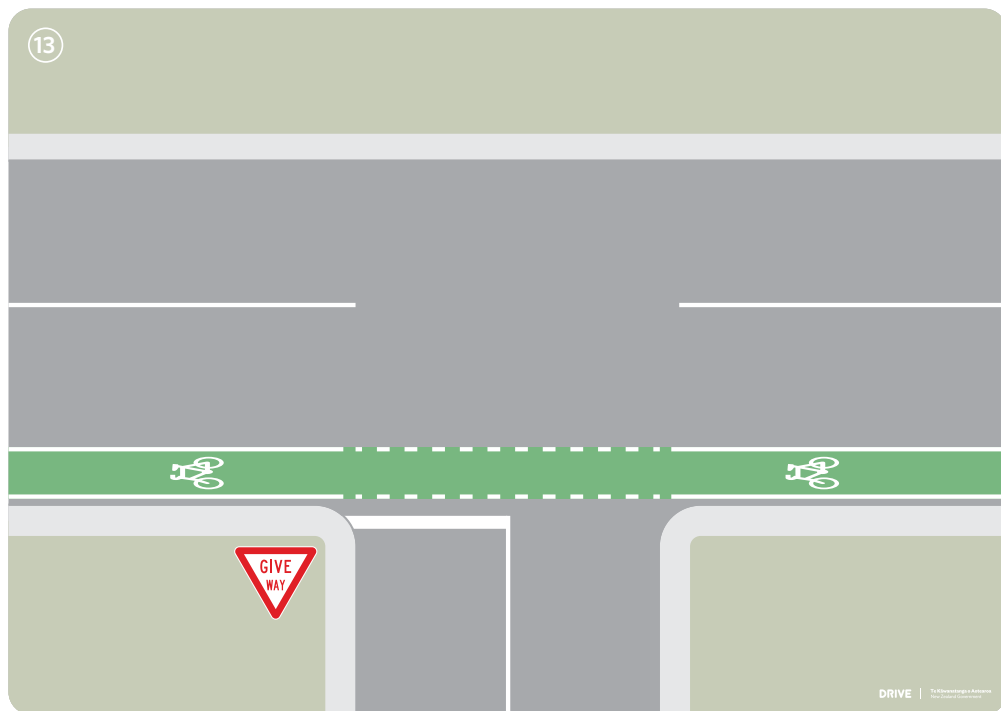

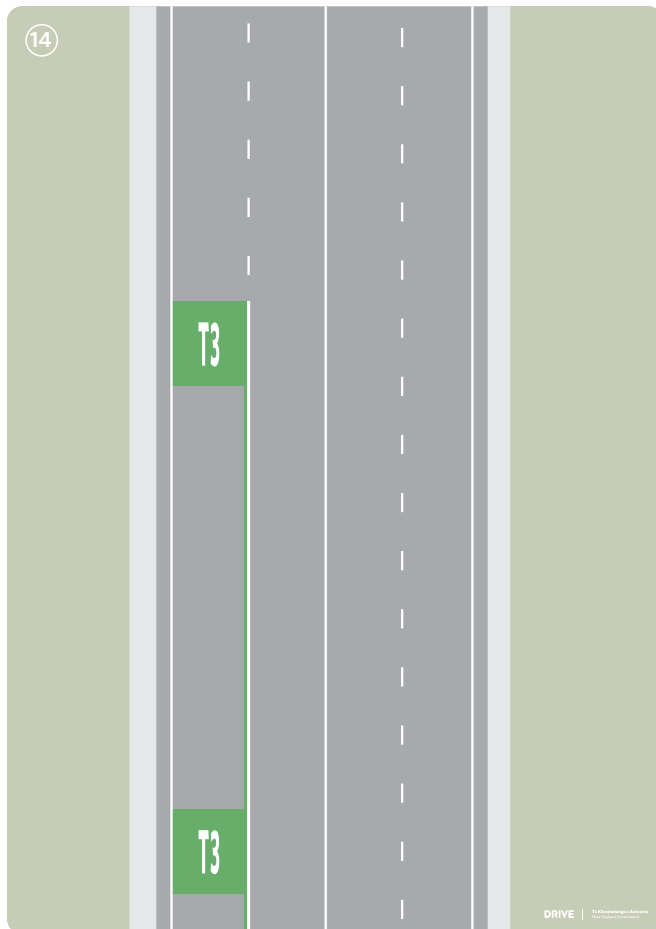

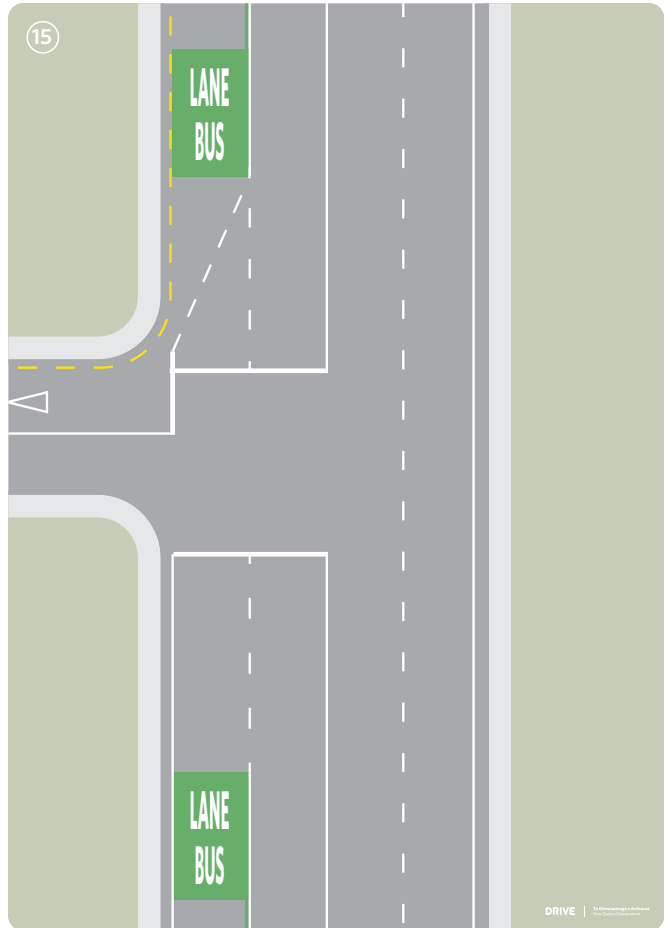

This layout can be used to teach:

- » The difference between a bus lane and a bus-only lane (page 30).
- » Making a left turn into a side road or driveway when there is a bus lane, checking for and giving way to buses, the 50m rule (page 54).

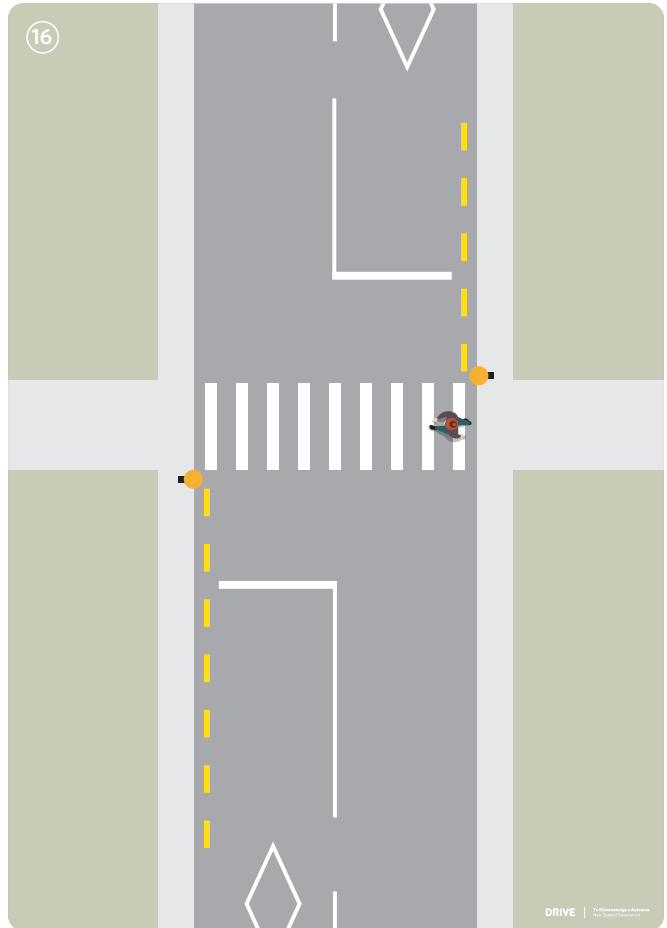
