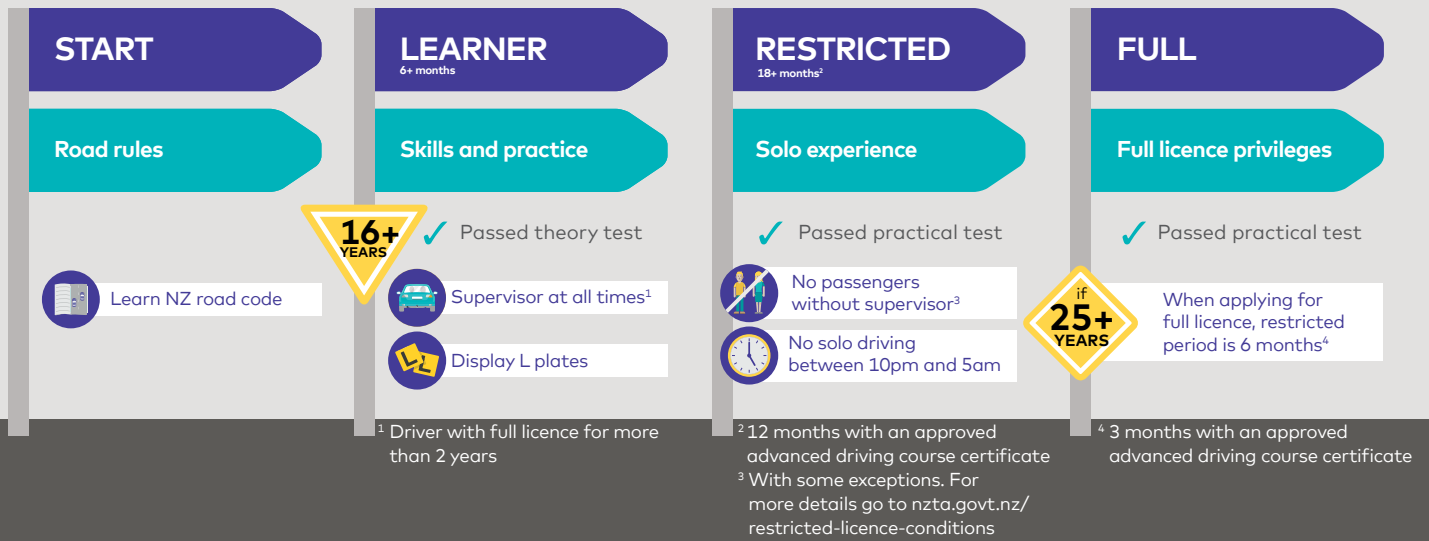

Book at a licensing agent in person

## ID required for booking



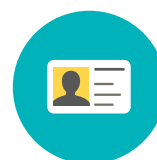
Current NZ passport

OR

- Expired NZ passport (up to 2 years)
- Overseas passport
- Original NZ birth certificate

- Student ID
- IRD number
- Bill/bank statement
- Community Services card
- Kiwi Access card

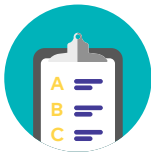
## What happens in the test



30 minutes  
to complete



Computer test



Multi-choice



Must get 32 questions  
right to pass



All questions based  
on road code

## On test day



Arrive early,  
at least  
10 minutes before



Take photo ID



Take glasses if you  
wear them



Report and  
wait inside

## When you get your learner licence



Take your licence  
with you at  
all times



Must display  
L plates



Zero alcohol  
for under 20s



Must have supervisor  
(full licence for 2 years)  
with you at all times

build up practice



Practise in the safest  
vehicle possible



Expect mistakes –  
they're a part  
of learning



Seek help from a

for restricted
