







What they learn

Players learn what not to do in the driving tests and the differences between critical errors and immediate fails.



How it works

Identify and organise test errors into categories as a team or as individuals.


- 1x Instruction card per team
- 1x set of 12 Common Mistakes activity cards per team

Critical errors:

- Not doing a head check and checking mirrors when changing lanes (#4)
- Stalling at lights (#5)
- Not observing and looking ahead when going through an intersection (#6)
- Not signalling when leaving a roundabout (#7)
- Not coming to a complete stop at a stop sign. Pausing to look but not coming to a complete stop. (Note this is an immediate fail in the full licence test) (#8)
- Not doing a head check or mirror check when leaving a parking space (#10)
- Not looking both ways before driving over train tracks (#11)

Immediate fails:

- Going over the speed limit by 6km/h for 30 seconds (#1)
- Driving through a stop sign (#2)
- Not giving way (e.g. at a give way sign or intersection) (#3)
- Going through road works at 40km/h instead of 30km/h because people are tooting (#9)
- Going over the speed limit by 11km/h (#12)





When you do your practical licence test there are some mistakes that will mean you instantly fail and others that are considered critical errors.

A critical error is a serious driving error that doesn't result in immediate danger to any road user or property.

An immediate fail error is any driving that is of immediate danger to any road user or property or results in another road user having to take evasive action.

Instructions

- 1. As a team or on your own, sort the common test mistakes into either the 'Critical Error' or the 'Immediate Fail Error' group.
- 2. When you've put all the mistakes into a group, ask your facilitator to check to see whether you've got it right.

Going over the speed limit by 6km/h for 30 seconds.

Common Test Mistake #3

Not giving way (e.g. at a give way sign or intersection).



Common Test Mistake #4

Not doing a head check and checking mirrors when changing lanes.

Note: Need to check before and after every turn, and when changing lanes, merging and leaving or stopping at a kerb. Should be checking mirrors every 8–12 seconds.





Common Test Mistake #5

Stalling at lights.

Not observing and looking ahead when going through an intersection.

Common Test Mistake #7

Not signalling when leaving a roundabout.

Not coming to a complete stop at a stop sign. Pausing to look but not coming to a complete stop.





Common Test Mistake #9

Going through road works at 40km/h instead of 30km/h because people are tooting.



Common Test Mistake #10

Not doing a head check or mirror check when leaving a parking space.

Note: You need to do them when leaving a kerb, changing lanes or merging.
